Read Matthew 5.13–20

In this part of the Sermon on the Mount, Jesus explains that salt that has lost its properties is no good for anything and, just as light is visible for miles around, so we need to 'let our lights shine' for God. Jesus says he is not coming to abolish any laws and therefore urges his hearers to be obedient.

A note on the passage.

Jesus used the familiar images of salt and light to challenge his disciples about how to be effective for him. Salt transforms what it is mixed with in a variety of ways, while light is visible for miles around. Here is the test: are we making a difference in our situations and shining for Jesus' glory?



What does it mean to be salt and light in our world?

Prayer Walk



Wrap up warm and walk (some of) the streets of your local area, praying as you go. As you pass different types of building, pray for whatever is happening there. Let your imagination fuel your prayers as you walk and listen for the prompting of the Spirit – e.g. as you pass a particular house where you know there is a need, or for those struggling with school. If you are feeling brave, you could ask people who pass you in the street if they would like you to pray for them (or something important to them). You may be surprised! If you aren't able to walk physically, you could use a local map to help you imagine a walk, or just look through the window and pray for what you see.
